Discussion and possible action regarding The Beergo's annual agreement for their 2020 events.

BACKGROUND:

The Beergo has requested to review the annual agreement for 2020 events. In 2019, The Beergo had informed the Joint Board of their interest in how their 10% revenue donation is spent. Per their 2019 agreement, this money was to be contributed to Parks & Recreation to go towards the City/Village budget based on where their event occurred.

In 2020, they are seeking to have further input on how their 10% donation is spent, specifically towards parks.

Events have already been approved for both Roll-up Beer Gardens at Nettesheim Park (Fridays, June 19, July 17, August 21) and Parktoberfest (Fridays/Saturdays in September/October @ Kiwanis Village Park).

Attached items include The Beergo's requested edits to their 2020 agreement for both the Roll-up Beer Garden series and the Parktoberfest series.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Beergo currently donates 10% of food and beverage sales for all events. In 2019, that was a total of \$4,327.85 (\$652 to Pewaukee Youth Baseball).

Parktoberfest - Village = \$2,683.25

City/PYB Event = \$1,644.60

SPONSORSHIP/USE AGREEMENT

This Sponsorship/Use Agreement (hereinafter “Agreement”) is made and entered into this **11th day of March, 2020**, by and between the CITY OF PEWAUKEE, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, through its Joint Park Recreation Department (hereinafter referred to as the “Department”) and **Buddies of Environmental Enjoyment and Recreation (B.E.E.R.)**, a Wisconsin **recognized Official Non-profit Club**, duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as “Sponsor”)

WHEREAS, the Department owns and operates Nettesheim Park, South Park, & Balmer Park, which facility has a pavilion, restroom facilities and other amenities (hereinafter the “Premises”); and

WHEREAS, the Department and Sponsor are desirous of conducting an event on Fridays, June 19, July 17 and August 21 at Nettesheim Park, to be known as Summer Roll Up Beer Garden; and

WHEREAS, Sponsor is desirous of being a sponsor and operator of the event at Nettesheim Park; and

WHEREAS, Sponsor has the option to contract Milwaukee West, LLC (d/b/a “The Beergo”) for purposes of marketing, promotion, and event production. Additionally, sponsor has option to collaborate with Pewaukee Youth Baseball for the June 19, 2020 event at Nettesheim Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby covenant and agreed as follows:

1. The Department does hereby grant access to the Nettesheim Park pavilions and concession area (the Premises) as depicted on the attached maps, Exhibit A.
2. The Department hereby grants said access on Friday, June 19, July 17 and August 21, 2020.
3. In addition to the use of the Premises, the Department agrees to provide picnic tables, and trash and recycling receptacles, for the use of the Sponsor during the course of the event.
4. Sponsor is hereby permitted **to serve food** and to sell beer and other beverages subject to the grant of an approval for a Class B Beer License from the City of Pewaukee for said event.

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5. This Agreement is conditioned upon the Common Council of the City of Pewaukee issuing a Temporary Liquor License to sponsor for this event. The Sponsor acknowledges that this License is temporary and only valid during the dates of said event.

6. Sponsor will **serve food**, as well as beer, wine and beverages as provided for hereunder, and further agrees to arrange for the performance of music with a live performer, using non-amplified or minimally amplified music as approved by the Joint Park and Recreation Board.

7. The hours of operation shall be **Fridays from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.** Sponsor may engage in restocking or cleanup activities outside of these hours; however, the performance of these activities shall not last more than one hour before or after the aforementioned hours of operation.

8. Responsibilities of Sponsor:

- a. Sponsor acknowledges that the Park is a public space and must remain open and accessible to the public throughout the course of the event.
- b. Sponsor agrees not to discriminate against anyone desiring to participate in the event on the basis of age, race, sex, marital status or any other prohibited basis of discrimination.
- c. Sponsor agrees that the space that is being utilized shall be maintained so as to permit access as required under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- d. Sponsor agrees to pay all taxes or fees associated with the operation of the event.
- e. Sponsor agrees, at its own expense, to keep the premises and surrounding area clean and sanitary at all times. Garbage shall be collected during the course of the event, which will be picked up by the Department daily. However, extra refuse pickups will be at the expense of the Sponsor.
- f. No equipment being provided by the Department shall be removed or replaced without the written consent of the Department and any such use will be at the expense of the Sponsor.
- g. Sponsor agrees that they will obtain all necessary licenses or permits to conduct the operations as contemplated hereunder, and will comply with all local Health Code requirements, as well as Building Code requirements.
- h. Sponsor agrees to post a \$300.00 deposit for the return of the keys to the Premises at the conclusion of the event.

9. The parties shall mutually perform an inspection of the Premises both prior to the commencement of this Agreement, as well as following it, so as to verify that the condition of the Premises meets the requirements as set forth in this Agreement. Sponsor agrees to return the Premises to the Department following the conclusion of the event in the condition that existed prior to the commencement of the event, reasonable wear and tear excepted.



10. Sponsor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Department as and against any and all claims, demands, actions, causes of action, or fees, including actual attorney fees, arising from the activities of the Sponsor, their agents, subcontractors or assigns, in conducting the Summer Pop Up Beer Garden as well as the performance of the terms of this Agreement. This indemnification shall include the acts or omissions of any contractors or subcontractors that they may engage for the performance of the event.

11. Sponsor agrees that this Agreement is exclusive to them and to the extent they wish to engage other entities to assist with the performance of the event, such entities must be approved by the Joint Park and Recreation Board of the Department or their designee, and such subcontractors must agree to the same indemnity and insurance requirements as required of the Sponsor.

12. Sponsor acknowledges that they are ultimately responsible for the acts or omissions of any subcontractors with which they may engage.

13. The parties agree to mutually perform advertising for the event; however, any advertising prepared by the Sponsor must be approved by the Joint Park and Recreation Board or their designee.

14. Sponsor acknowledges that they are not permitted to bring in additional lighting without the express written permission of the Department. Strings of lights are permitted, provided that each bulb is not greater than 25 watts in capacity. The Sponsor may also bring in and set up a point of sale station and credit card station at their expense.

15. Department agrees to maintain the bathrooms in the respective park during the course of this event consistent with its normal operating policies; meaning that the bathrooms will be maintained daily. Sponsor agrees that during the course of the event, they will monitor the condition of the bathrooms and will assess and clean them throughout the event as necessary.

16. Sponsor agrees to restrict the areas in which beer consumption is permitted to those that are shown on the attached map (Exhibit A) and will create signage directing patrons that alcohol may only be consumed within the designated area.

17. As part of the consideration for this Agreement, the Sponsor agrees to **donate** to the Department ten (10%) percent of the gross receipts from **food and beverage** sales made as part of the July 12-13 event and all sales made as part of the June 14-15 and August 16-17 event not less than thirty (30) days following the completion of the event. Sponsor further agrees to provide the Department with sales records satisfactory to the Department **to be used with input from B.E.E.R.**



18. Sponsor shall provide security during the event and will ensure that the terms of this Agreement, the respective Park Rules and Department Ordinances are followed. Any criminal activity shall be reported immediately to the City Police Department (Waukesha Sheriff).

19. Sponsor agrees to provide evidence of comprehensive, general liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 in the aggregate, which insurance shall list the City of Pewaukee as an Additional Insured on a primary and non-contributory basis.

20. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

21. Each party acknowledges that the person signing the Agreement has been duly authorized by the governing body of each entity.

22. This Agreement represents the complete understanding of the parties with respect to the subject matter set forth herein, and may only be amended in a subsequent agreement executed by all parties.

23. To the extent that any portion of the Agreement is deemed to be unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the parties agree that the balance of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

SPONSORSHIP/USE AGREEMENT

This Sponsorship/Use Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is made and entered into this 11th day of March, 2020, by and between the VILLAGE OF PEWAUKEE, a Wisconsin municipal corporation, through its Joint Park Recreation Department (hereinafter referred to as the "Village") and Buddies of Environmental Enjoyment and Recreation (B.E.E.R.), a Wisconsin recognized Official Non-profit Club, duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin (hereinafter referred to as "Sponsor")

WHEREAS, the Village owns and operates Kiwanis Village Park, which facility has a pavilion, restroom facilities and other amenities (hereinafter the "Premises"); and

WHEREAS, the Village and Sponsor are desirous of conducting an event on Fridays, and Saturdays between September 11, 2020 and October 2, 2020 to be known as Pewaukee Parktoberfest, sponsored by The Beergo; and

WHEREAS, Sponsor is desirous of being a sponsor and operator of the event at Kiwanis Village Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby covenant and agreed as follows:

1. The Village does hereby grant access to the Kiwanis Village Park pavilion and concession area (the Premises) as depicted on the attached map, Exhibit A.
2. The Village hereby grants said access on Fridays and Saturdays, commencing September 11, 2020 and running through October 2, 2020.
3. In addition to the use of the Premises, the Village agrees to provide picnic tables, and trash and recycling receptacles, for the use of the Sponsor during the course of the event.
4. Sponsor is hereby permitted to serve pre-prepared food and to sell beer and other beverages subject to the grant of an approval for a Temporary Class B Beer License from the Village of Pewaukee for said event.
5. This Agreement is conditioned upon the Village Board of the Village of Pewaukee issuing a Temporary Class B Beer License to sponsor for this event.

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6. Sponsor will **serve pre-prepared food**, as well as beer and beverages as provided for hereunder, and further agrees to arrange for the performance of music with a live performer, using non-amplified or minimally amplified music as approved by the Joint Park and Recreation Board.

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7. The hours of operation shall be Fridays from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.; and Saturdays from **24:00 p.m.** to 9:00 p.m. Sponsor may engage in restocking or cleanup activities outside of these hours; however, the performance of these activities shall not last more than one hour before or after the aforementioned hours of operation.

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8. Responsibilities of Sponsor:

- a. Sponsor acknowledges that the Park is a public space and must remain open and accessible to the public throughout the course of the event.
- b. Sponsor agrees not to discriminate against anyone desiring to participate in the event on the basis of age, race, sex, marital status or any other prohibited basis of discrimination.
- c. Sponsor agrees that the space that is being utilized shall be maintained so as to permit access as required under the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- d. Sponsor agrees to pay all taxes or fees associated with the operation of the event.

As part of the consideration for this Agreement, the Sponsor agrees to ~~pay-donate~~ to the Village ten (10%) percent of the gross receipts from all food and beverage sales made as part of the event not less than thirty (30) days following the completion of the event. Sponsor further agrees to provide the Village with sales records satisfactory to the Village to support their calculation of the amount to be ~~paid-donated~~ to the Village to be used with input from B.E.E.R.

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18. Sponsor shall provide security during the event and will ensure that the terms of this Agreement, the Kiwanis Village Park Rules and Village Ordinances are followed. Any criminal activity shall be reported immediately to the Village Police Department.

19. Sponsor agrees to provide evidence of comprehensive, general liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 in the aggregate, which insurance shall list the Village as an Additional Insured on a primary and non-contributory basis.

BACKGROUND:

Nick met with WE Energies, our electrician, Tim of raSmith, Ken of Beachside Boat & Bait, and Parks staff on Monday, February 24th. We were presented with a number of options for the parking lot project, specifically transformer relocation, that also included the potential to have all service from the transformers (to our building, Loie's building and Park Ave Pizza) underground, which would mean not having an electrical pole on site. This would save us a little more space, but also not have any overhead power lines in the parking lot, connecting to our property, or the two neighboring properties. The initial proposal did have underground service to Loie's building.

In order to gather accurate quotes for this, it was necessary to receive access to the Park Avenue Pizza building and we were able to schedule. The owner of Park Avenue Pizza has currently stated that he is not interested in paying for any fees/improvements to his building and electrical service. He also stated that the rough estimate of ~\$10,000 for his portion of the parking lot seems high and he is not necessarily interested in that.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The below items are for your review to complete the transformer relocation to create connections to each building. All options would include underground (trenched) service to Loie Laimon's building. There may be potential cost savings for not having an electrical pole on site, and potential increases for trench work - awaiting WE Energies updated quote. All options would start with base rate of ~\$13,000 of transformer relocation fees + curbing around transformers and asphalt repair fees.

Option 1 - Underground service to Laimon Family Lakeside building, overhead service from our electrical pole to Park Avenue Pizza. Connection to our building underground \$2,620. The overhead service from the electrical pole to Park Avenue Pizza would not have any costs associated.

Option 2 - Underground service to both Laimon Family Lakeside building and Park Avenue Pizza (no electrical pole on site). \$2,620 for Laimon building, \$8,660 for Park Ave Pizza connection. Total additional expense of \$11,280.

Option 3 - Underground service to Laimon Family Lakeside building, overhead service to Park Avenue Pizza from across Park Avenue (no electrical pole on site). \$2,620 for Laimon building, \$12,650 for Park Ave Pizza connection. Total additional expense of \$15,270.

The Friends of the Parks of Pewaukee and interested parties, are asking permission to solicit funds from team sponsors and businesses for replacement of 1 possibly 2 scoreboards.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

A quote from BSN Sports for two scoreboards came back with a total of \$6,324 (\$3,162 each). I'm not sure if this price would increase if purchasing one. Installation could be completed by our parks staff.

To add advertisement panels, there are additional fees:

- Across top, 1' high x 6' wide = \$429
- Across top, 1 1/2' high x 6' wide = \$493
- Advertisement panels could be replaced with a new sponsor in the future through working with a sign company (ex: Fast Signs, Sign-o-rama)

Shipping fee is \$365. If adding an advertisement panel, shipping may increase slightly.

Our parks staff is recommending two new support posts per scoreboard, and an estimate of \$400 to complete the support posts.

If all included, this would be a total of about \$3,973-4,220 per scoreboard with an advertisement panel.

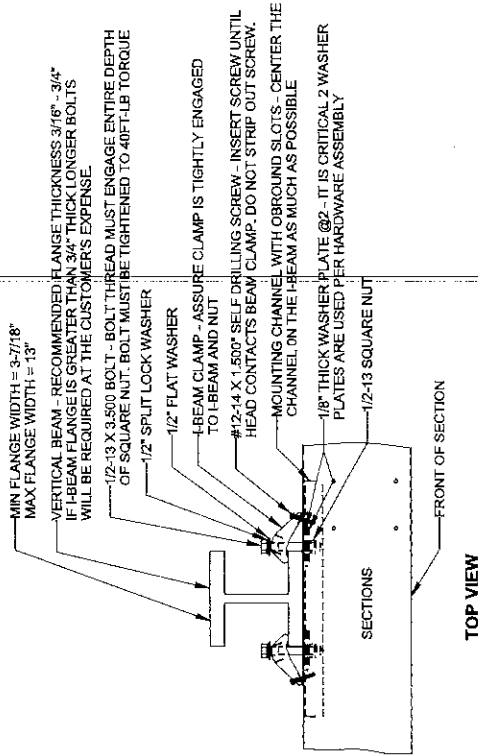

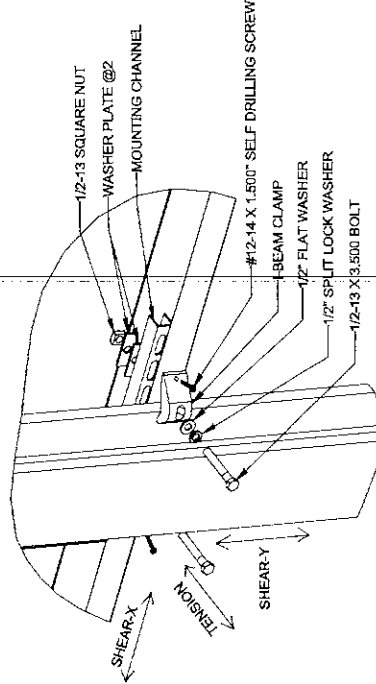
FRONT ROTATED VIEW

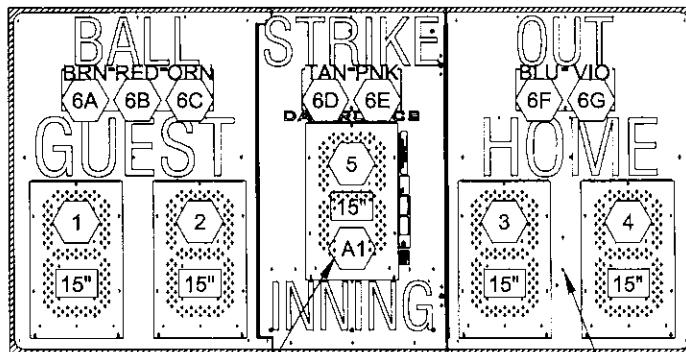
